COURSE TITLE	DIPLOMA IN MONTESSORI STUDIES 6-12 YEARS														
COURSE DESCRIPTION	<p>The Diploma in Montessori Studies 6-12 years is suitable for already qualified teachers or assistants who need knowledge and understanding of Montessori education for ages 6-12 years. It is a non-accredited course and is not an initial teacher education course, so will not give candidates teacher registration.</p> <p>The Modules prepare candidates with the knowledge and understanding of the Montessori philosophy and approach, as well as the specific Montessori curriculum, for the primary years.</p>														
COURSE DELIVERY	<p>The Diploma is studied over one year (full time) and up to two years (part time). The course is divided into five modules.</p> <p>Approximate study times for each of the five modules is approximately 200 hours, 1000 hours in total.</p> <p>One week (35 hours) of Professional Experience is required for each Curriculum Module, after attendance at the associated workshop and in conjunction with the assignments. A total of 140 hours (four weeks).</p> <p>If the candidate is already employed, professional experience may be undertaken at place of employment, but a qualified and experienced Montessori teacher will need to supervise the experience.</p>														
PREREQUISITES	<p>Applicants will require:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • an Australian recognised teaching qualification • or for teacher assistants, a qualification which allows them to assist in the classroom. 														
COURSE STRUCTURE	<p>The Diploma is divided into five modules. Full time study is one introductory and then completion of two curriculum modules each semester. MODULE IM 120 hours study time	INTRODUCTION TO MONTESSORI PHILOSOPHY	<p>This introductory module provides the opportunity to build an understanding of the importance of historical and social context on educational experiences and the history of Montessori education in Australia. You should examine, evaluate, analyse and compare Montessori and other educational theories and practices today. MODULE EG 220 hours study time	PREPARED ENVIRONMENT & GEOMETRY	<p>This Module develops understanding of the importance of environments for learning. Students investigate how pedagogical considerations impact on children's indoor and outdoor experiences and learn how Montessori educators design, maintain and monitor quality environments. It provides for the developing of practical skills, strategies and competency in methods of observing and documenting children's development in conjunction with Montessori Geometry curriculum knowledge and understanding. MODULE DM 220 hours study time	FOUNDATIONS OF DEVELOPMENT AND MATHEMATICS CURRICULUM	<p>The module addresses Montessori and educational theories of pedagogy and child development. It also explores appropriate curriculum, practices and processes for numeracy learning across the domains of concept formation, linear & hierarchical numbers, decimal and other bases, patterns and order, mathematical reasoning and problem solving. It aims to develop understanding of the principles and delivery of a repertoire of strategies and resources, essential for effective mathematical learning in Montessori environments. Links are made to knowledge and understanding of National and State curriculum requirements.</p>	<p>6-12 Mathematics (5 days)</p>
MODULE AL 220 hours study time	ROLE OF ADULTS AND LANGUAGE CURRICULUM	<p>This module aims to develop an understanding of teachers' roles and responsibilities in Montessori classrooms. Teachers have an important role, and the module examines how this role may differ from a more traditional role. The module also offers the opportunity to build knowledge and skills in delivering appropriate curriculum for meeting children's developmental needs, including the principles and delivery of a repertoire of strategies and resources, essential for effective literacy learning as well as knowledge and understanding of National and State curriculum requirements.</p>	<p>6-12 Language (5 days)</p>
MODULE IC 220 hours study time	INTERCONNECTEDNESS OF LIFE AND COSMIC EDUCATION	<p>The module aims to develop understanding of children's learning in the areas of the humanities; social sciences; science; arts, technology, health and physical education. It introduces you to activities and experiences in Geography, History, Economics & Civics so children learn to understand the world through cross-cultural and interrelated studies across a range of experiences. Activities and experiences are structured so children see learning as a way of thinking and seeing the world. An emphasis is placed on hands-on investigations within interrelated studies emphasising the relation of science to technology and society today as a way of enabling children to become creative, happy and healthy members of society.</p>	<p>6-12 Cosmic (5 days)</p>
