COURSE TITLE DIPLOMA OF EDUCATION (MONTESSORI) 3-6 OR 6-12 YEARS COURSE The Diploma of Education (Montessori) is accredited with the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) and the 3-6 focus is recognised by the Australian Children's DESCRIPTION Education and Care Quality Authority (ACECQA) as an approved Diploma level Early Childhood qualification. For those who already have a Bachelor of Education and teacher registration, studying the Diploma 3-6 would prepare you to work as an Early Childhood Teacher (ECT) in a school or centre* and the 6-12 focus is suitable for teaching in Montessori primary environments. Note, it is not an initial teacher education course and will not give you teacher registration. *This ACECQA provision is in place until end 2023. COURSE Approximate study times for the Diploma Course are: **DELIVERY** Introductory and Four Theory Modules 360 hours • Four Curriculum Modules (inc workshops) 760 hours Professional Experience* 240 hours Examinations 60 hours TOTAL - 1420 hours nominal *Professional experience is undertaken in recognised, registered Australian schools or early childhood environments with the required range of curriculum materials. Professional experience is to be in environments other than student's current employment, except in exceptional circumstances (maximum of three weeks allowed in own environment). PREREQUISITES Applicants will require: Evidence of satisfactory completion of Year 12 in Australia (inc General English minimum) or evidence of one-year tertiary study in an Australian Institution. An overseas equivalent with evidence of an English Language assessment (IELTS)* Completion of an IELTS Academic Test (within past 2 years) is required for applicants who have an overseas qualification and English as a Second Language. A score of seven (7.0) or more in reading and writing and a score of eight (8.0) or more in speaking and listening is a prerequisite for enrolment. *The IELTS test must be an Academic Test, General Training IELTS tests are not acceptable. COURSE The Diploma Course is divided into nine modules. Full time study is one theory and one curriculum module each semester: STRUCTURE Introductory Module • Eight Modules taken over 4 semesters (or 8 semesters part time). Full time study is one theory and one curriculum module each semester. You may not enrol in two curriculum modules within the same semester. 240 hours of Professional Experience One written and one practical examination at the end of the course of study. The Montessori Institute is committed to recognising prior studies and other relevant learning CREDIT FOR that contributes towards satisfying requirements for its courses. Credit for Prior Learning PRIOR (CPL) is an integral part of our service and everyone is entitled to apply. 

THEORY MODULE ONE 40 hours study time	INTRODUCTION TO MONTESSORI EDUCATION	Explores the effects of historical and social context on individual educational experiences, as well as the history of Montessori education in Australia. Students examine, evaluate, analyse and compare Montessori and other educational theories.	Introduction & Obs & Record Keeping 2 days
MODULE E 80 hours study time	EDUCATIONAL AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT THEORY	Addresses Montessori and educational theories of pedagogy and child development. Montessori philosophy and practices are seen in perspective with contemporary and historical educational practices and requirements such as the Early Years Learning Framework and the Australian Curriculum. Understanding of current thinking and research in the areas of child development are explored, to inform student's own philosophy of learning.	None
MODULE P 80 hours study time	MONTESSORI PHILOSOPHY AND PRACTICE	Contrasts educational theories and principles of education with Montessori principles and practices. The premise central to her work, was that educational methods should be derived from careful observation and study of the child.	None
MODULE F 80 hours study time	IMPORTANCE OF FAMILY AND QUALITY ENVIRONMENTS	Develops an understanding of the importance of environments for learning and that the Montessori approach to education is based on aiding the child. All aspects, emotional, cognitive, physical and spiritual are planned for and goals and outcomes fit together to form a comprehensive whole from birth to adulthood.	None
MODULE T 80 hours study time	ROLE OF THE TEACHER	Explores teachers' roles and responsibilities and the importance of communicating and collaborating with families in a range of ethical ways. It examines some of the issues that affect teachers at the professional level, including consideration of engaging those with diverse backgrounds and culture.	None
CURRICULUM MODULE O 250 hours study time	OBSERVATION AND CLASSROOM MANAGEMENT	Examines the foundations of children's learning and develops knowledge and understanding of National and State curriculum requirements. Students acquire skills, strategies and competency in methods of observing and documenting children's development and learning, considering their diverse or additional needs. MODULE L 250 hours study time	LANGUAGE AND LITERACY	Develops an understanding of children's language development and curriculum for meeting children's developmental requirements, including those with a disability or special educational needs.
